

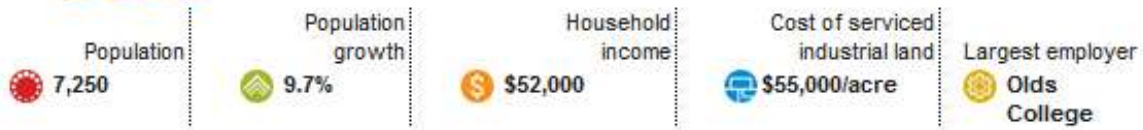

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OLDS



Situated along Highway 2, the town of Olds, with a population of 7,250, easily serves more than 40,000 people in the Mountain View County area in addition to the 57,000 who drive through the community.

Among the major projects approved by the town are a school, housing development and a business banking complex, and a steadily increasing number of business licenses have been issued. Nearly 20% more business licences were issued in January 2010 than in January 2009.

Special incentives or business-friendly policies	BizPal will be operational in April 2010; strong working relationship between Town's Development & Approvals Branch and the Olds Institute for Community & Regional Development (OICRD) Community Economic Development Office has resulted in enhanced services to the business community. Town & OICRD-CEDO have recently completed the CAEP Community Investment Readiness Initiative (CIR) and have in place an investor-ready community profile. CIR action and marketing plans are in progress. A new look for both the Town and OICRD's websites is in progress and will be launched this year. Marketing video clips are being produced and will provide potential investors insight into why Olds should be on their radar screen. Town marketing and development staff along with CEDO and key community stakeholders are being trained in CED Training Programs - Business Retention & Expansion, and Business & Investment Attraction - this spring.
